Roll Camera! Action!

Welcome to Eurofurence! This year's theme is the magic of movies, and we've done all we can to make it show: Our Guest of Honor is Timothy Albee, computer animator of Disney and Babylon 5 fame. Besides the regular video show, we'll have a dedicated Film Event on Friday night, and some very interesting panels about how to start your own little project!

Another thing is special this time: This year, Eurofurence is celebrating its 10th anniversary. What started out as a cozy little house party back in 1994 has grown into the most important annual "furry" event on the European continent. Somehow it's hard to believe that Eurofurence has been around for so long already.

So much has changed over the years. Eurofurence has been growing slowly compared to its American counterparts. Even by European standards, we're still a small convention. For EFX we're expecting slightly less than 300 attendees, which puts us on par with the average science fiction conventions here in Germany – and they have a bigger fandom than we have! So, that's definitely not bad. Also, being small allows for some special luxury, the one thing that makes Eurofurence so different from your average con: Being able to run our convention like a big party!

Besides the growth, many other things have changed, for example the way Eurofurence is being organized. In the year 2000, Eurofurence became a registered social organisation („eingetragener Verein“). It is now guaranteed by law that every well-meaning person can become a member, and that fundamental decisions will always be made in a democratic fashion.

The third important change, which came subtly over the years, is the stabilization of the EF organisational team. While early Eurofurences were run by entirely different people each year, the core staff stays largely the same nowadays. And I think that's a very good thing. It's very hard to find good staff, and it takes years for someone new to gain the necessary experience. And running a con needs a lot of experience!

But no matter how much we've grown and improved, we would not have such a great convention, perhaps not even such a great fandom, without the people who started it all, ten years ago:

4 Rules of conduct

Eurofurence strives to give as many people as possible a fun time. Most of the convention is open for general audiences, except for Art Show and Dealer's Den. If you are under 18, you will only be allowed admittance to those areas or events which are appropriate for a general audience. Please always wear your badge, think of it as your admission ticket. If you fail to show your badge when security asks you to, you might be asked some uncomfortable questions.

Adult members, please be aware that minors may be present in nonrestricted areas, and consider what kind of material (comics, art, or sketchbooks for example) you want to show or pass around.

general conduct

Eurofurence likes to present itself as a small, but professional convention. We also hope that each attendee has all the fun that our wide-ranging community can provide. Please be considerate of how your actions reflect on the convention and how they may impact or affect others.

We take pride in our appearance and we want you to as well while still having fun. Offending newcomers, visitors and consite personnel is not appropriate. Impressing them with how much fun and enthusiasm we have in our fandom *is*. What you consider to be acceptable behavior may not be so for others. We encourage that courtesy from all participants in our community.

costumes and clothing

Use your common sense in public areas inside the building, and especially when you are outside. If you have to ask or think twice about doing it in public, take it to your room. For example, kissing and holding hands, re-

gardless of sexual orientation, is fine. Groping, tongue battles, nudity and beyond, regardless of sexual orientation, is not. While collars and leashes may be worn discreetly, blatant displays of bondage and BDSM in public are not allowed. Public exposure of genitalia, buttocks or (female) breasts is not permitted. As a rule, a minimum of a non-thong bathing suit must be worn at all times in public areas. "Anatomically correct" costumes must be likewise clothed. Security may ask you to stop an activity or to move it to a private room. Repeat offenders may be required to leave the convention.

harassment and assault

No means no. Stop means stop. Go away means go away. If someone won't understand these simple rules, contact a helpful member of security. They have the right to exclude attendees from the convention for not following these commands. Harassment is any behavior that intentionally annoys or alarms another person. This includes unwanted physical contact, following someone around in a public area without a legitimate reason, or threatening physical violence. If you are being harassed, immediately go to any member of security. The offender may be excluded from the convention and the matter may be referred to the proper law enforcement authorities.

alcohol and parties

Eurofurence does not tolerate the serving of alcohol to minors. If you have a private party at which alcohol is served, please designate a responsible adult to not drink, so that there is a fully competent person present to deal with any emergencies that might arise. Eurofurence does not tolerate the use of illegal substances. Violation of the above rules could

subject you to the immediate exclusion from the convention and referral of the matter to other authorities. The last thing we want is for someone attending our convention to end up in the hands of the local law enforcement authorities, in the hospital, or even worse.

While room activities can be considered private, accommodations are not off limits. Regulations regarding alcohol and drugs are still in

effect. Also, please be considerate of people sharing the room with you. Space is limited – room assignment may group you with someone who does not join in, nor care much for your activities. They are guests too, so please try not to annoy them too much.

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Due to the potential damage to property (of the location as well as of attendees), water guns, silly string and the like are prohibited

inside the buildings. When playing outside, please do not hit any bystanders. Artists are present. Destroying original art, sketchbooks, comics, or prints is not considered funny, and will definitely limit your chances to get a free sketch. Ever.

Generally all weapons must be checked by the security staff. If a weapon is part of your costume, please ask someone of our security staff to approve it. Even relatively harmless items like staves can cause injuries in a crowded place. Try not to toy around with them.

photography and videotape

Eurofurence wants you to have great memories from a fantastic convention. Photographs and videotape footage by attendees are generally allowed in all common areas of the convention with the exception of the Art Show and Dealer's Den. Specific rules regarding these matters may exist for selected events.

When photographing or videotaping individuals or costumes, please use common

courtesy and ask before photographing them. Please respect their rights if they do not wish to be photographed or videotaped.

Individuals may take pictures and videotapes for private viewing or sharing with friends. Photography or videography for the purpose of sale or publication to the press is expressly forbidden unless written permission has been obtained from Eurofurence e.V.

Some events will be videotaped for the purposes of producing the convention highlights video. Videotaping will also be conducted in public areas of the convention. No videotaping by convention staff will be conducted in guest rooms or in any other areas where an attendee has a reasonable expectation of privacy.

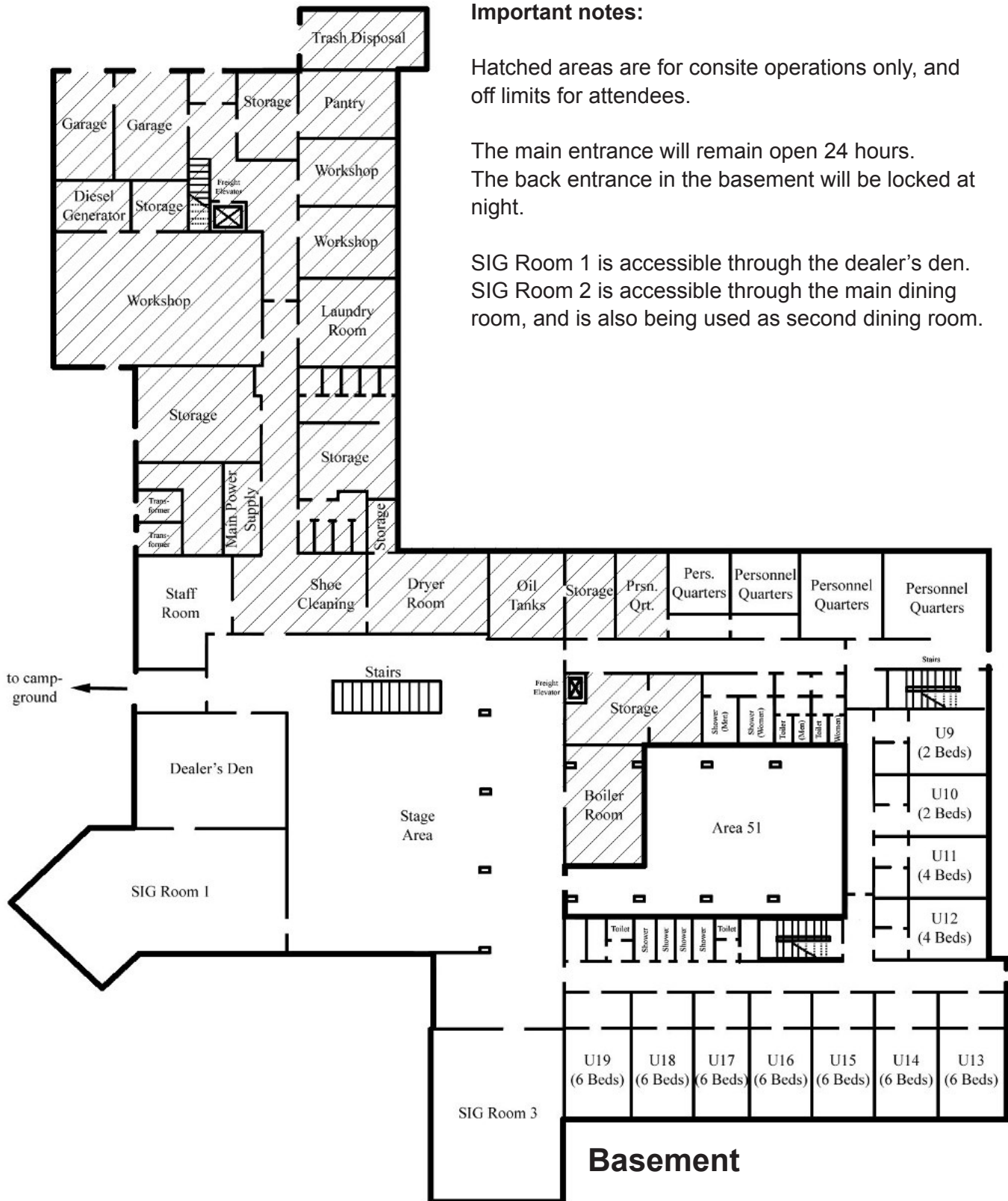
Attendees should be aware that footage gathered in public areas of the convention – including events and panels – may be used in a highlights tape, and that attendees may appear in that tape without compensation. Eurofurence will require a release only for footage that is obtained in areas that are not fully public (i.e. private functions and personal interviews.)



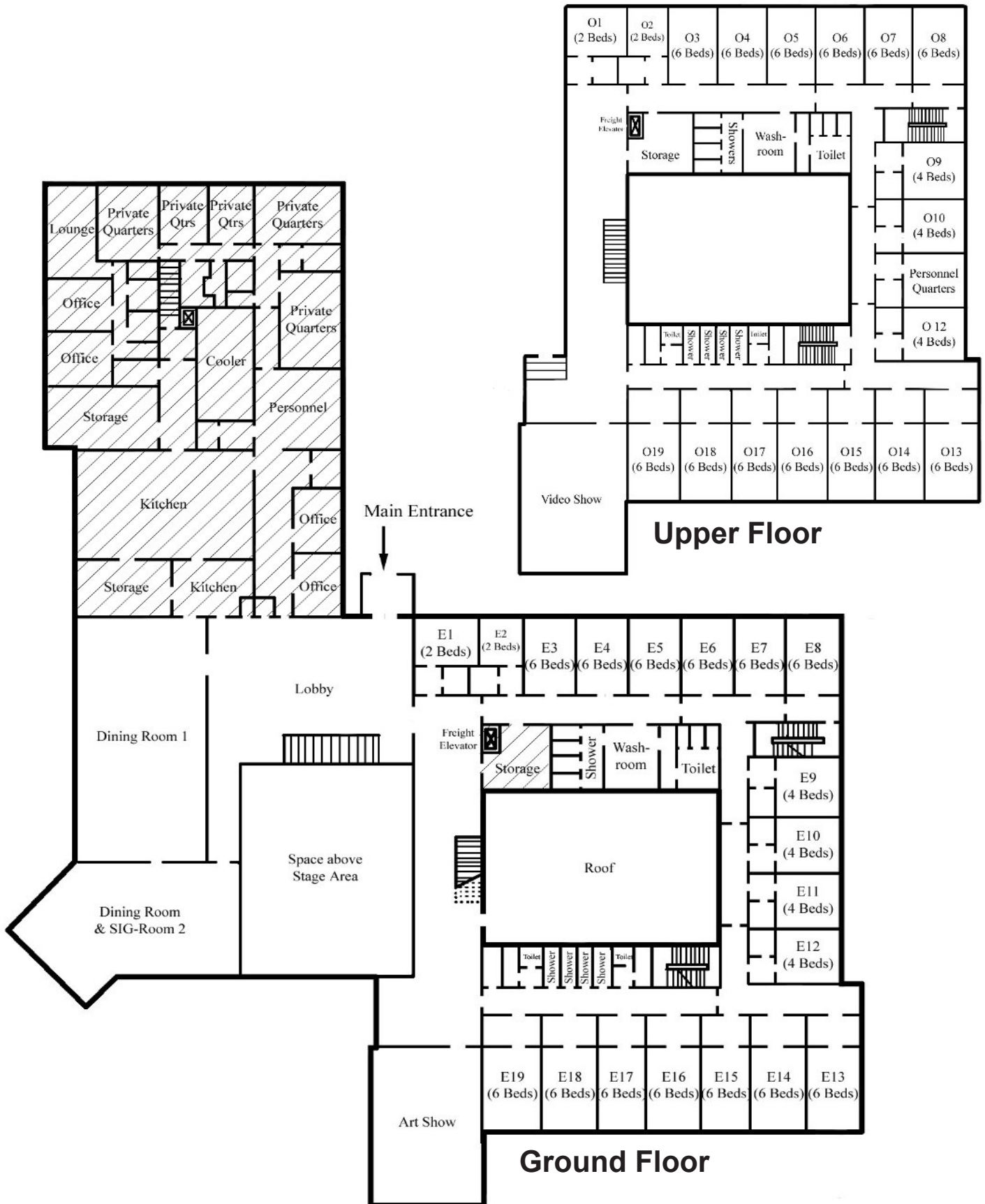


The Boom Giraffe

Guest of Honor: Timothy Albee

When he first saw the animated feature *Robin Hood*, it was clear to him: He wanted to work for Disney, the people who created these images of places of pure distilled emotion. Years

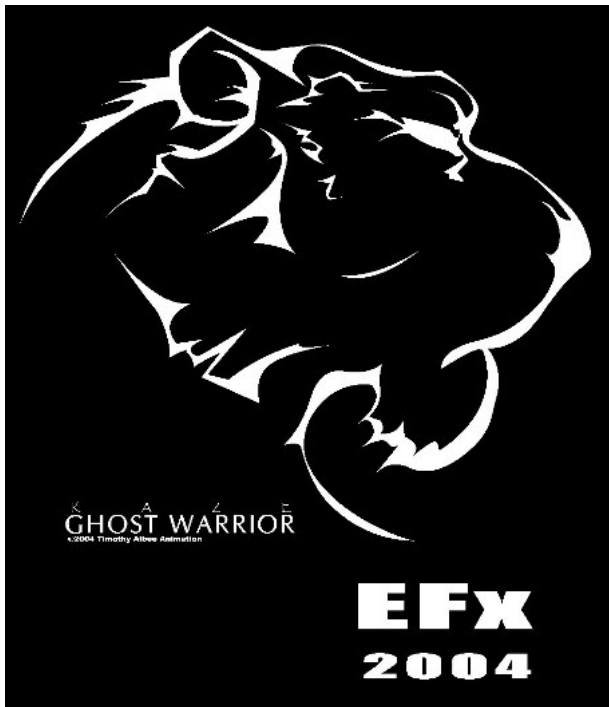
later, his dream became true. He wound up in Los Angeles, working on such prestigious projects like the fifth season of *Babylon 5* and the *Babylon 5* movie: *Thirdspace* and Disney's *Dinosaur*. However, the lack of challenges and artistic freedom tired him. So, in the year 2001, he decided to write his own rules. Today, Timothy Albee paints, writes, and animates in his own little cabin in the middle of nowhere. Or to be more precise: Fox, Alaska, 20 miles north of Fairbanks.

An artist from birth, now a thirteen-year veteran of the entertainment industry, Timothy has chosen to direct his focus into the realization of his true vision, and the helping of others to believe in and achieve their own dreams.

His latest project is a 23 minute CGI short, titled *Kaze, Ghost Warrior*, which he created in part to prove a point: That the technology exists today to allow a single filmmaker, through the medium of CGI, to do what industry professionals accept should take hundreds of people working with a budget of millions of dollars. It is his belief that there are those who would

change the face of cinema if only they knew that their dreams of making films on their own, with a limited budget and affordable production tools, is something they can achieve. Modern computer animation imposes few limits on creativity.

His other dedication is his team of sled dogs. Mushing is a major new focus of Tim's current life. He sees it as a way to blur the lines between human and nature, to bond with his dogs, and to challenge himself. He says, the animals are his spiritual teachers, because by nature, they have the all-out honesty that most humans don't.

Timothy is finding his place in Alaska, and when he's not busy caring for his dogs, or working on animation projects, he creates digital paintings. He's had gallery shows around Fairbanks. "Most people think of 3D Art as harsh, sharp-edged computer stuff: Reflecting spheres, chess board, or whatever. The work that I do, I try to make it look just like good art, it doesn't matter what's been used to create it."

Timothy has written several books about Lightwave, his software of choice he uses to create his images and films. His newest, *CGI Filmmaking: The Creation of Ghost Warrior*, explores how a small team, or dedicated individual, can create a work that can stand on its own next to the great animated films of our time.



History of Eurofurence

Pawpets on the loose

The big hall is cloaked in darkness. Only a few specks of light from a person's cell phone or ripped blinding on the windows make the people in the room aware of what's going on in front of them. Shadows can be seen on the stage, bustling about and setting up things until they finally disappear and the murmur of the crowd ceases into expectant silence. The music starts, light comes on, bathing the stage in bright colors, and the audience finds themselves inside of another adventure.

At this year's Eurofurence we'll meet them again, our four heroes from Lionel Scritchie's Dormitory. For all those who haven't seen one of the previous shows, here is a fast-forward view through the stages of the show:

Eurofurence 6: This was the first LSD show ever. Four pawpeteers performed funny songs and skits on a much too small pawpet stage. There was no storyline or live voice acting, it was just for fun. After the show, a Puppet-SIG was held at the same place, followed by "Public Puppet Fun" where the audience was trying their own paws at puppetry on stage.

Eurofurence 7: "Medieval Madness" was the show's topic, and madness it was! Our heroes were transported

hundreds of years back in time because they didn't properly do the time warp. Getting back to the present involved the dreadful desert, a miraculous monolith, her Ladyship's labrador and the 21st century fox. Sounds confusing?

You bet! This show introduced the characters of Lionel, Lori and Poke to the public. The pawpets were acting together with normal furies, making the show a lot of fun.

Eurofurence 8: The "FIA" topic left an obvious mark on the show. Poke, Lionel and Lori got themselves involved in dubious scheming of the "Furry Intelligence Agency", an underground organisation set up to purify the fandom from anything dirty. Poke and Lori explored another side of themselves while Lionel tried to find a remedy. A huge amount of planning and designing went into this show, and the result was well worth it.

Eurofurence 9: "Czechology" became the unofficial EF9 motto, and the LSD show wasn't to be spared. Starting off with broken microphones, the show was restarted, and the actors pulled off a number of hilarious "déjà vu" pranks. Due to Lori's excessive phone calls, our heroes were left without funds during their holiday trip. Desperate, they agree to do a Saturday night show in the hotel to pay for their rooms. And it revealed the glimpse of a hidden secret shared between Lori and Mika.

Kaze, Ghost Warrior

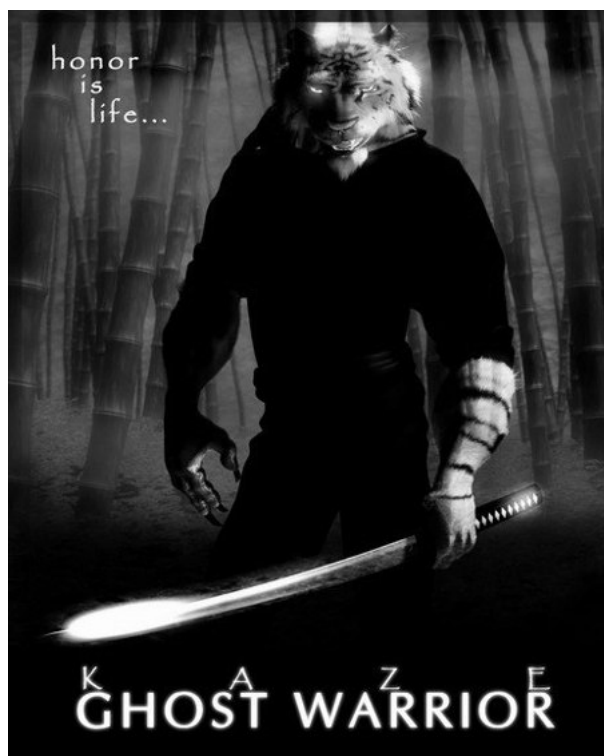

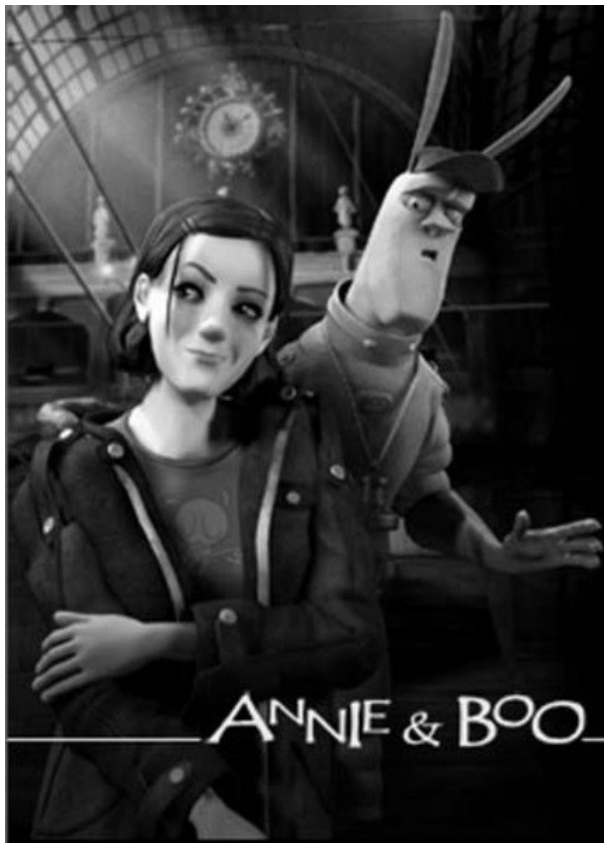

The film is a simple, yet poetic tale of an outsider's yearning for a sense of belonging. It was originally conceived as a short story by Mat Charles, a story in the style of a fable, about, well, a wolf who comes in from the cold. It won "Best Animation award" at the Hollywood MiniDV Film Festival 2003, and was part of the official selection of the New York Short Film Festival 2004.



annie & boo

What if coincidences were living, breathing entities? And what would happen if a human and a coincidence met? Would either one of them ever be the same again? "Annie & Boo" is a magical tale about a girl named Annie, and a coincidence named Boo, which answers these questions. The film has been showing in the festival circuit since 2003, and there is little wonder that it has won so many awards, including three – Art Direction, Best Student Film, and the Grand Prix Imagina – at the prestigious Imagina Festival in Monte Carlo.

In this workshop, we'll cover the subjects of different types of journalistic media, the various forms of coverage, and ways to protect you and the fandom from unpleasant publicity.

Meet Timothy Albee

Come and join an open chat with Timothy Albee in a relaxed atmosphere. This is a neat possibility to ask him the questions you didn't get to ask Friday evening, talk about any topics that we don't have a separate event for, discuss Timothy's work, or have your book and/or DVD signed, too.

Anthropomorphic Beasts – How far from reality?

Genetically engineered creatures have been part of modern literature since the early beginnings of science fiction. How far-fetched is it, for example, to assume that maybe one day, human soldiers will be replaced with genetically engineered species? Speculative discussion about facts and fantasy surrounding the hot topic of genetic engineering, followed by a role-playing session in which the participants are to design a fictitious commercial war-beast (or other) that a company would be willing to invest in, and that someone might actually want to buy. 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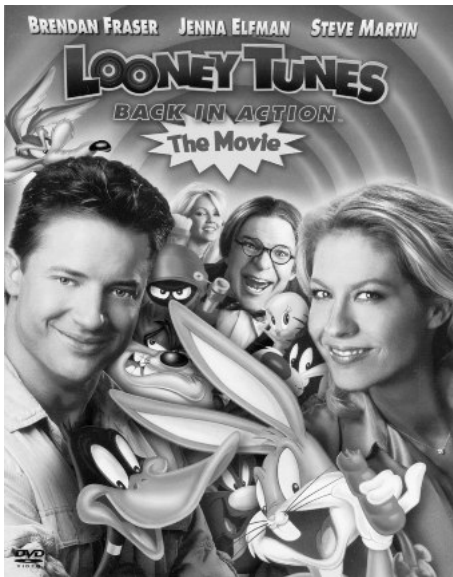

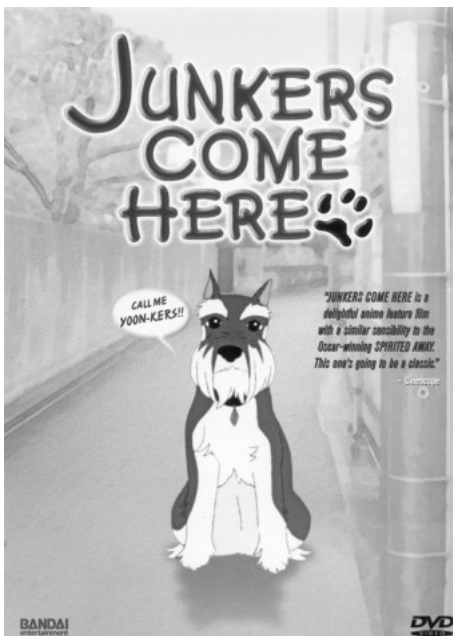
looney tunes back in action

Looney Tunes Back in Action (Joe Dante, USA, 2003)

Language: English

Subtitles: -

“Looney Tunes: Back in Action” mixes the beloved WB cartoon characters with live-action surroundings and actors. It helps to have director Joe Dante at the helm, recapturing the same sort of zany glee that 1984’s “Gremlins” had. At Warner Brothers studio in Los Angeles, Bugs Bunny and Daffy Duck are a long-time acting duo who continue to rake in big box-office. With test results showing that Bugs is the bigger star, and with Daffy sick of playing second fiddle to the rabbit, Daffy is abruptly fired by studio exec Kate Houghton. Recognizing her mistake after it is too late, Kate and Bugs Bunny set out to convince Daffy that he is needed at the studio. Their pursuit for him turns out to be more than they bargained for, as Daffy and recently fired stuntman DJ Drake have fled to rescue DJ’s kidnapped actor father from the clutches of the Acme Corporation, headed by the maniacal Mr. Chairman.



junkers come here

Junkers Come Here (Junichi Sato, Japan, 1995)

Language: English

Subtitles: -

Junkers Come Here has originally been released in 1995. Directed by Junichi Sato, it is based on two original novels written by Naoto Kine.

Hiromi is your typical Japanese eleven-year-old, yet her dog Junkers is anything but typical. The little schnauzer can actually talk, but to avoid becoming a media spectacle, he only talks to Hiromi. Day in and day out, Junkers keeps Hiromi company as her parents are always away from home. Her father is a commercials director and away on location for weeks at a time, while her mother is an executive putting in the long hours, coming home late at night or sleeping at the office. With her parents discussing divorce, Hiromi pretends that there’s nothing wrong, but Junkers and Hiromi’s tutor can both see how much she really is hurting inside. A miracle would be needed to make things better, but how many miracles can a girl get?

The *Lion King 1½* is both a parody and an ingenious sequel that retells the original film's story from the perspective of best pals Timon the meerkat and Pumbaa the warthog. Anyone who has wondered how this odd couple met will find out here, beginning with Timon's flight from home following disgrace and his chance encounter with the sweet but lonely Pumbaa. With the arrival of young Simba, *The Lion King's* familiar tale is reborn through a fresh angle, fleshed out by returning characters like Rafiki the wise monkey, Shenzi, and Simba's love interest, Nala. While the retooled narrative proves a novel experience, *The Lion King 1½* is really a vehicle for voice actors Lane and Sabella, whose comic performances are shamelessly, broadly funny. Matthew Broderick, Julie Kavner, and Jerry Stiller are also in the vocal cast.

labyrinth

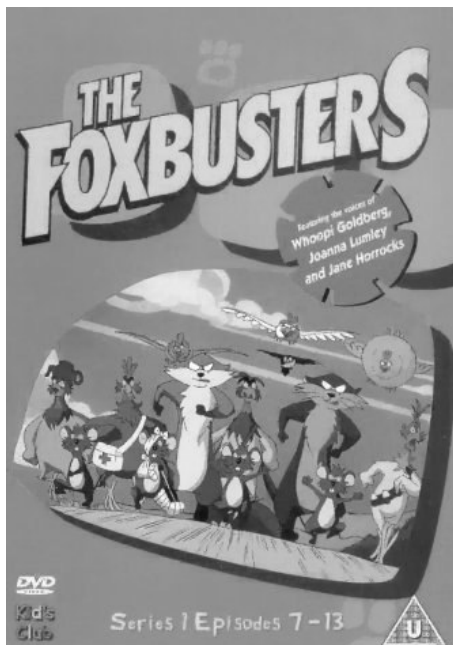
Labyrinth (Jim Henson, USA, 1986)

Subtitles: -

“Labyrinth” is a movie that was made with infinite care and pains, and it began with a real inspiration: Why not create a fantasy out of some of the drawings of M. C. Escher, who is famous for visual paradoxes such as a room with staircases that go “up” in every possible direction?

The film takes the form of a nightmare that visits the heroine Sarah, who lives in her own dreamworld of magic and legend. She’s left to reluctantly baby-sit her kid brother, and when she annoyedly wishes the goblins would take him away, she gets her wish. She is visited by Jareth, the ruler of the mystical world that is just out of sight of ordinary eyes. He challenges her with a task: She can get the child back, but only if she finds her way through a vast labyrinth to Jareth’s castle in the center. Little does she know about the visual and logical paradoxes that she will stumble over, and the strange and unusual creatures who inhabit the labyrinth, and who may be friend or foe.



fox busters

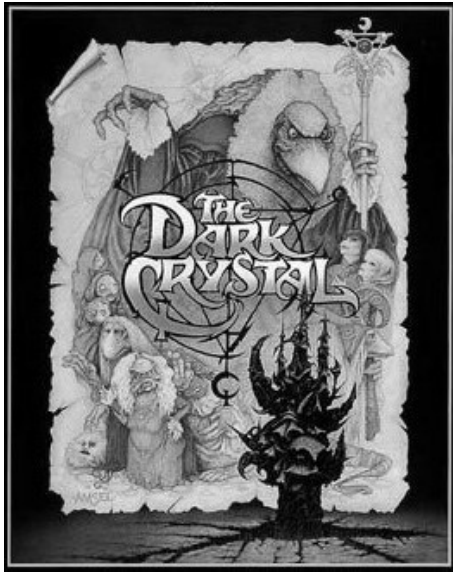
Fox Busters (Season 1 & 2) (Various, USA, 2003)

The chickens of Foxearth Farm are at the mercy of fox King Voracious and his ever-hungry pack. Or they might be, were it not for those dambusting chickens of the sky, The Foxbusters. Ransome, Sims and Jeffries are hens with wings, defying the Old Wive’s Tale that ‘chickens can’t fly’ and always alert to that not-so fantastic Mr Fox and friends. Whenever the enemy is spied, he is soon driven off by a volley of grit pellets, egg bombs and more! The Foxbusters was adapted from the best-selling children’s book by author Dick King-Smith. He remains perhaps most familiar as the author of Babe, but his other works are myriad and much-loved too. The series won the 2000 BAFTA Award (“Best Animated Children’s Series”) and the 2000 British Animation Award (“Best Children’s Series”).

the dark crystal

The Dark Crystal (Jim Henson, USA, 1982)

Language: English

Subtitles: -

In a faraway world a mighty astronomical event is about to occur, the great conjunction of the planet's three suns. At this time, the cruel Skeksis who rule this world from the castle of the Dark Crystal are frightened to learn that an ancient prophecy may become true: A survivor of the Gelflings, an elfin race they thought they had destroyed, is seeking to restore the missing shard of the Dark Crystal before the moment of the great conjunction, thus ending the tyranny of the Skeksis. Hidden in the valley of the urRu, young Jen the Gelfling has been raised by a tribe of mystics. He knows little of the world outside, but his master's dying words have charged him with his mission to find the lost shard before it is too late. Traveling through many strange places and encountering many extraordinary beings, Jen races against time to unravel the mystery of his quest and save his world from the forces of evil.



tigress of king river

Tigress of King River (Bhandit Rittakol, Thailand, 2002)

Original Title: Sabsua Thi Lam Nam Kasat

Language: Thai

Subtitles: English

Set in early King Rama V era, former British soldier Peter Bain is busted for trying to sell defective firearms to influential Chinese merchant Yang. Forced to hunt wild game with these firearms along with Yang's men, Bain links up with ex-monk Wan and Karen-American hunter Julia, who he meets on the way to the jungle. The group sets off to hunt an elephant, said to be protected by a ghostly tigress that can transform itself into a woman. The tigress is supposedly possessed by the vengeful spirit of Nian, a woman who was tortured and killed in the King River Battle almost a century earlier. As Wan learns more about the tigress myth, he tries to release Nian's spirit, but Yang's men want to destroy Nian and get the elephant. With greed, resentment, and karma from past lives encircling the group, violence lurks just around the corner.

the cat returns

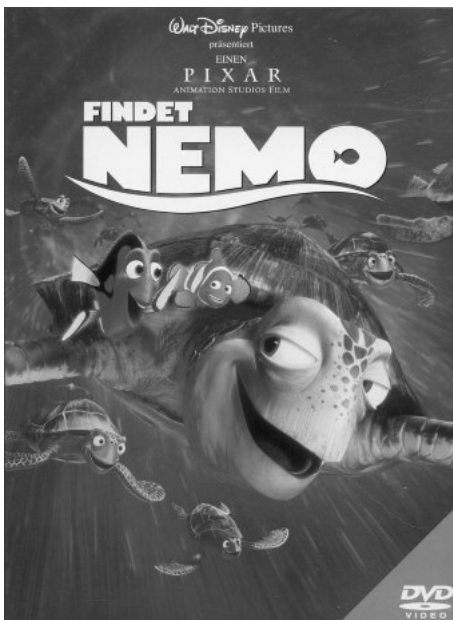
The Cat Returns (Hiroyuki Morita, Japan, 2002)

Original Title: *Neko no ongaeshi*

Language: Japanese / Subtitles: English

After the wild but fully justified furore surrounding *Spirited Away*, Studio Ghibli's next production is a much lower key affair, clearly aimed at a younger market.

"The Cat Returns" tells the story of teenaged schoolgirl Haru, who saves a cat from being run down by a truck. To her shock and amazement, the cat rises onto its two hind feet and thanks her. The cat turns out to be the prince of the Kingdom of Cats, an alternate universe ruled and inhabited entirely by cats. As a sign of his gratitude, the King offers Haru his son's hand in marriage. The official western title for this movie is "The Cat Returns", though the direct translation of the title would be "The Cat's Returned Favor". It is likely called that because the cat hero of the story, The Baron, was featured in another Ghibli film, "Whisper of the Heart". Hiroyuki Morita's earlier works include "Tenchi Muyo! 2". He also worked as a Key Animator on "My Neighbors the Yamadas" and as an inbetween animator on "Kiki's Delivery Service".



finding nemo

Finding Nemo (Andrew Stanton, USA, 2003)

Language: English / Subtitles: -

When his son Nemo is captured by a scuba-diver, a nervous-nellie clownfish named Marlin sets off into the vast – and astonishingly detailed – ocean to find him. Along the way he hooks up with a scatterbrained blue tang fish named Dory, who's both helpful and a hindrance, sometimes at the same time. Faced with sharks, deep-sea anglers, fields of poisonous jellyfish, sea turtles, pelicans, and much more, Marlin rises above his neuroses in this wonderfully funny and nonstop thrill ride. Rarely do more than 10 minutes pass without a sequence destined to become a theme park attraction. Pixar continues its run of impeccable artistic and economic success. "Finding Nemo" is written and directed by Andrew Stanton, who also directed "A Bug's Life" in 1998. Lee Unkrich, who co-directed "Toy Story 2" and "Monsters, Inc." returns in this capacity for *Finding Nemo*.



the raccoons

The Raccoons Episode 1-4 (Kevin Gillis, Canada, 1985)

Language: English / Subtitles: -

In the Evergreen Forest, there is a group of raccoons, the most rambunctious being Bert. Their home is peaceful and beautiful, but also threatened by the greedy aardvark industrialist, Cyril Sneer, who wants to destroy the forest for his own profit. Together with some dog friends and Cedric Sneer, Cyril's sympathetic son, they work to oppose Cyril through their newspaper and environmental initiatives. As the series progresses, they eventually win him over as they find themselves allied against other environmental dangers and enemies. We are showing the first episodes of this lovely television series that many furries probably remember from when they were 5 or 6 years old. It was the only Canadian cartoon to be produced entirely within the country. Exceptional animation for a TV series, interesting characters, and the unforgettable songs made this a stand-out.



brother bear

Brother Bear (Aaron Blaise, USA, 2003)

Language: English / Subtitles: -

This was the final production of Disney Florida studio before it was closed down, and the second-but-last "traditional" animated feature ever to be produced by Disney. The Florida studio produced the company's latest hand-drawn movies including "Lilo & Stitch" and "Pocahontas".

Set in the Pacific Northwest before the invasion of the white man, "Brother Bear" is the story of the youngest of three sons, whose oldest brother died when he accidentally disturbed a mother bear, who killed him in defense of her cubs. Enraged, the young man sets out to hunt the bear himself when his other brother refuses to form a hunting party right away. In his hunt for vengeance however, the spirits of the forest transform the young man into the very thing that he sought to slay... a bear. Seeing the world through the bear's eyes, the young man will learn valuable lessons about the circle of life. But in the meantime, the last brother – who believes both his siblings dead – sets out to kill the bear to avenge his brothers' deaths... unaware that the bear he hunts *is* his brother.

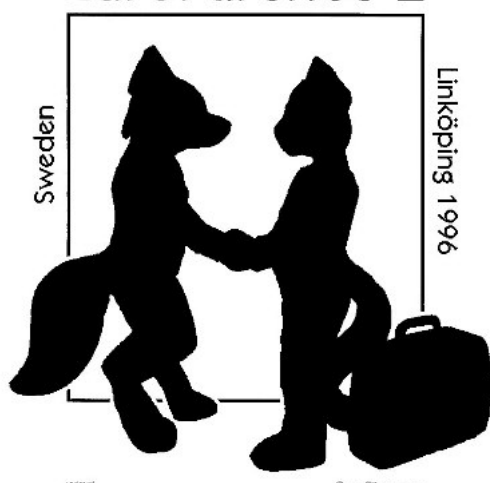
34 T-shirt contests
